Dr. Jalam Singh Rathore, Epidemiologist, Integrated Disease Surveillance Programme (IDSP), Dept of Medical, Health & Family Welfare (Government of Rajasthan)

Dr Jalam Singh Rathore is alumni of PGDPHM (2010-11, IIPH-D). Till July 2015 he was working as District Epidemiologist in the office of Chief Medical & Health Officer, Alwar, and during that tenure he was appointed as coordinator for smoke free Alwar campaign. Although at that time Alwar was not a part of National Tobacco Control Programme (NTCP), but through technical support from PSI they started a massive drive for enforcement of Control of Tobacco Products Act (COTPA 2003) for a month, which was further extended to another month, due to its success. As a part of this initiative, district level steering committee and task force (district and sub district level) was formed for enforcement

in their jurisdiction areas. Dr. Jalam was a member of both district level steering committee and task force and was also assigned as coordinator for smoke free campaign. Trainings of district and block level officers were conducted, and legal and punitive action against people violating the campaign was decided. After completion of drive, in an Independent survey conducted by third party, Alwar was found eligible to be declared as smoke free district. The declaration was made by Honorable minister of Food and Supply Shri Hem Singh Ji Bhadana on independence day, at district level. Now Alwar has been included among NTCP districts and anti tobacco cell is taking care of programmatic activities.

Social Sunday initiative by IIPH-Gandhinagar Alumni

On Mothers Day, Social Sunday conducted Anaemia Detection cum Awareness Camp at Lilapur Village Ahmedabad District. This activity was jointly done by Social Sunday and Heart Foundation Ahmedabad. Resource person is Dr. Rajesh Mehta, founder of Human Health circle. About 40 adolescent girls and mothers took part in this camp which focussed on checking their anaemia status and providing knowledge to prevent anaemia through life style modifications. Social Sunday delivered lecture and provided a platform for one to one discussion about anaemia and associated health issues. IEC materials were also shared

for creating awareness amongst the masses. The Social Sunday representatives also shared their contact numbers with participants to discuss any health problems and create awareness to deal with it appropriately.

Dr. Kartavya Tiwari, MPH 1st Year Student, IIPH-D



Dr Kartavya Tiwari is a PGDPHM alumni of IIPH-D from 2014-15 batch and currently pursuing MPH from IIPH-Delhi. After completion of his PGDPHM program he joined Reliance Foundation for a a short term assignment- JIO Health Application Implementation. The project was implemented at Mukundpur Block of Urban SBS Nagar District, Punjab, India, with support from Punjab Government. The project focussed on helping following deliverables:

- 1. Help digitalize patient records and provide tools to better administrate local healthcare facilities by implementation of professional health application.
- 2. Help the healthcare personnel in Primary Health Centres and Sub-centres adapt to technology based patient record systems.
- 3. Demonstrate risk stratification for noncommunicable diseases like Hypertension, Oral Cancer, Diabetes, etc. and help in creating first building blocks for a digital platform for continuity of care throughout the healthcare lifecycle.

Towards the end of the project, there was an increased efficiency in healthcare delivery through better data analytics, realtime progress reports and targeted/focused health action plans. 27 tech savvy public health personnel were identified to be potential ambassadors for JIO software. Further the demographic and clinical data was digitized

Dr. Kartavya Tiwari mentioned this as a valuable experience which gave him exposure to public health in practice. Through this assignment he experienced the functioning and implementation

of CSR at the ground level. Focused group discussion, interview & developing questionnaire in a real time situation helped him gain practical exposure in community mapping, needs assessment, community mobilization and gain maximum output in minimum resources & overcoming various barriers at different stages (Demography, Infrastructure, etc.), ultimately reaching the goal & creating a seamless impact.

Student Corner (Mr. Sunit Madhur, MPH 2nd Year student, IIPH-Gandhinagar)

As a part of my internship at Kamala Nehru Memorial Hospital I worked on two projects. My first project was to prepare a plan for enhancing Hospital Management Information System (HMIS) at Kamala Nehru Memorial Hospital. Under this project undertook four detailed steps and helped hospital undertake a step-by-step approach of enhancing its information management

software. These steps included reviewing the existing system, defining data needs, determining data flow, and identifying the vendor. Each of these steps had worksheets and formats that I prepared or adopted from various other sources. I was part of the vendor presentations and meetings and evaluated vendor's products during their online and on-site demos to the hospital decision makers.

My second project was to prepare a plan to ensure quality of care in the hospital using cost-recovery process. Under this project, I conducted a patient survey to understand patient satisfaction level and in-depth interviews to understand the motivation and satisfaction among KNMH staff members. With the active help and involvement of the hospital management we identified a quality goal for the hospital that is to improve patient satisfaction through reduced cost of medicines, better organization of front services, and improved nursing practices. For this project I used kaizen approach to find out continuous, incremental improvements to achieve above mentioned quality goal.

I was lucky enough both ways that Kamala Nehru Memorial Hospital, Allahabad (KNMH Allahabad) provided me with such an opportunity to learn and grow into a more mature professional with an understanding of how issues work at the field. My two months at KNMH Allahabad were great right from gaining perspective to apply class-room teachings.

KNMH stands tall in the fields of public health and providing affordable quality of care to the poor patients of the country.

My sincere gratitude to every single individual and 2nd year nursing students in the KNMH who helped me carrying out my internship and research work. Their decades of experience and association with the hospital was helpful in understanding the processes and systems of the hospital. The patients of KNMH also played a vital role in the project, who were willing to talk to me and our field-investigators during our survey and many rounds of unstructured interviews.

This post would be incomplete without the mention of my mentor Dr. Kavitha Menon and guide Dr. Somen Saha at IIPHG who were always there with their insights and workable suggestions. Their guidance saved me from many temptations and helped me remain focused.
