# STRENGTHENING GENDER EQUITY AND INTERSECTIONALITY IN HEALTH POLICY AND SYSTEMS RESEARCH

We welcome applications for an 18-month fellowship programme on "Strengthening Gender Equity and Intersectionality" in Health Policy and Systems Research (HPSR). The fellowship aims to build skills in research, networking and leadership for early career researchers working in the broad area of HPSR. Early career researchers from a range of disciplines including public health, medicine and allied disciplines, environmental studies, humanities and social sciences, law and other relevant background may apply, subject to the eligibility criteria detailed below. Half of the total number of fellowships will support researchers whose work focusses on fragile and conflict affected areas.

The fellowship is offered by the Ramalingaswami Centre on Equity and Social Determinants of Health (RCESDH)<sup>2</sup>, a Centre of Excellence under the Public Health Foundation of India (PHFI), in collaboration with the United Nations University - International Institute for Global Health (UNU-IIGH)<sup>3</sup>, Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia.

#### **Details**

The duration of the fellowship is 18 months. The fellowship combines residential and distance modes of teaching and learning. Successful applicants will be mainly based in their home locations, and will be expected to participate in on-site workshops in Bangalore, India, complemented by field visits to research locations with indicative details as follows:

- 1. An introductory digital (online) module
- 2. A two day residential workshop
- 3. A four-week residential capacity building workshop
- 4. A week of field visits in India and Malaysia
- 5. A two-week writing and analysis workshop
- 6. Ongoing assignments and mentoring.

Fellows will be expected to develop and implement an independent research project building on training inputs, networking opportunities and mentoring. Successful completion of the fellowship programme will require the submission of a draft research paper based on the work done, as well as other course requirements.

This fellowship is intended to support early career professionals to acquire training and research expertise in gender and intersectionality analysis in HPSR.

#### **Faculty**

The programme will be taught by faculty with considerable experience working on gender equity / equality, intersectionality, health policy and systems research in LMIC contexts in the WHO-SEARO region. The faculty team will be led by Professors Gita Sen (RCESDH) and Pascale Allotey (UNU-IIGH).

## Potential benefits of this fellowship

- Identifying interesting research problems, including *inter alia* on conflict affected and fragile areas, which involve interactions between gender power, health systems and marginality in the SEARO region
- Conceptualising and implementing research projects based on the above
- Ongoing mentoring support
- Submission of draft research papers on the basis of the project

Network, cultivating research leadership, and strengthening of research communication skills

**Eligibility** 

Selection of fellows will be on the basis of demonstrable prior academic performance and

assessment of research potential. Selected candidates must have at least a Master's degree from a

recognised university or equivalent qualification. Early career professionals with degrees in

public health, medicine and allied disciplines, environmental studies, humanities and social

sciences, law and other relevant background are invited to apply. Candidates whose research

focusses on fragile and conflict affected areas are strongly encouraged to apply.

Post-graduate work experience in health related areas will be an advantage. Preference will be

given to candidates with higher degrees (MPhil, DPhil, PhD, DrPH).

**Eligible Countries** 

Citizens from SEARO countries: Bangladesh, Bhutan, Democratic People's Republic of Korea,

India, Indonesia, Maldives, Myanmar, Nepal, Sri Lanka, Thailand, Timor-Leste, are eligible to

apply.

Certification

Participants will receive a Certificate on successful completion of all components of the

fellowship programme.

**Grant coverage** 

The fellowship is a competitive award that will cover the cost of fees for the course, partial living

expenses, specified research costs, travel to the training programme and planned field visits.

#### Selection

Applicants will be selected on the basis of qualifications and research potential. Shortlisted candidates will be notified over email for an interview over Skype. Interviews will be scheduled in September 2019 and candidates are expected to be in locations with easy Skype and internet access. Selected candidates will be further notified by email in the last week of September 2019.
